


Bigfoot Adventure Challenge Lake Britton-Big Bend Route



Distance and Elevation: 40.5 miles and 3800 feet of climbing

Trailhead Location: Intersection of Clark Creek Road and Road to Lake Britton Picnic Area – just past the climb out of the dam

Route Directions:

- 1. Clark Creek Road Forest Rte 37N30 travel west on Clark Creek Road which turns to Forst Rte 3N30
- 2. Forest Rte 38N10 after crossing Rock Creek head uphill on Forest Rte 38N10 (main road...)
- 3. Summit Lake Road at a little over 6 miles in, the main road turns to Summit Lake Road (veer left), take this road all the way to just before Big Bend. Note that there will be an intersection just outside of Big Ben that Summit Lake Road will go left at, right will head towards Iron Canyon Reservoir. Head towards Big Bend
- 4. Big Bend and Big Bend Road after crossing the Pit River Summit Lake Road turns to Big Bend, stay on this as it starts to climb
- 5. Hagan Flat Road turn left on Hagan Flat Road just past the school and go past the Calire Big Bend Station. Stay on Hagan Flat Road, it will eventually cross the Pit River and you will go right and head upstream (some maps have this as Baker Road, others as Hagen Flat Road), it is the main road along the river, some paved, some gravel.
- 6. Hagan Flat Road-Forest Rte 37N06 this main road along the river (lots of cool PG&E hydro power plants, dams, campgrounds and small reservoirs to look at along with a awesome river and related wildlife) turns to Rte 37N06 as it get's closer to the finish, lot of this is paved, and you will have once last fairly big climb before you will see the Lake Britton Bridge, your finish is just beyond that.

Summary: This Bigfoot Adventure Challenge in Eastern Shasta County is an amazing adventure opportunity in a secluded, seldom traveled part of the region. The rider can expect a first half mostly gravel traverse through gorgeious oak and conifer forests with some decent climbs before coming through the community of Big Bend and an awesome second half along the Pit River with its grand big hydro facilities and beautiful river views.
